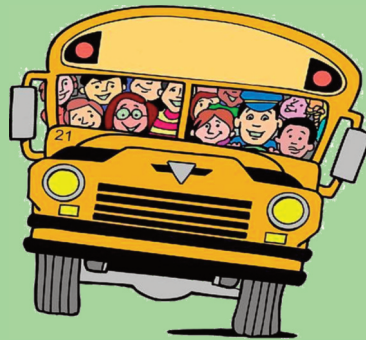
Are we creating a lost generation of children with no hope for the future?
